Racing

On Sunday July 26th, the Founders Cup will run to Sodus Bay from Oswego Yacht Club following their Sail Oswego Annual Regatta.

Tuesday, July 28th, the Genesee Yacht Club will host the start of the Centennial Cup Race to Sodus Bay, two days after the Youngstown Yacht Club's CanAm Regatta.

Wednesday July 29th the Freeman Cup overnight race out of SBYC will have a long (100 mile) course and a short (60 mile) course.

Friday July 31st through August 1st, SBYC will host three race courses with three-day and two-day racing for handicap and one design fleets.

Race Management

We have enlisted the help of well-known race management officials for the weeklong racing schedule. Officers will include Wayne Bretsch, Bill Topping, Larry Sill and scorekeeper Dan Hollands. The Notice of Race is almost complete with the help of club member Hank Stuart and should be posted shortly.

From the opening ceremonies on Thursday night to the chicken barbeque Friday and pig roast on Saturday, all followed by live entertainment, the evenings promise to filled with a lot of fun and friendship with crews from all around the lake. In the next month, you will be able to pre-register on our website for the races. At the same time, you can select to have lunches made for your crew for each of the 2-3 days of course racing, as well as buy the evening meals. All prices for meals and fees for racing will be discounted on the pre-registration form

plus we have even greater discounts if you buy a meal plan package. So watch for the pre-registration form on the web site around April 1st.
